Rev. Baldwin Avendano Calexico United Methodist Mission Calexico, CA Project | Loving Our Neighbors


#### <u>Testimony</u>

"My name is Baldwin Avendano, I am the pastor of Calexico United Methodist Church and director of Loving our Neighbors, assistance program for migrants. My journey through C2 Leadership Institute definitively was challenging but so encouraging at the same time. I was inspired to continue finding different ways and strategies so that our program can grow and be able to reach goals we have not accomplished in the past. Hyepin and her team were very supportive all the time for me and for our church's community program. During each session I was able to perceive from them a great interest in building along with you, step by step, the development of your initiative by each one of the different tasks, tools, resources, they are able to equip you with. I am convinced that after been assisted by FACE, our program will have great success in reaching our goals."

#### <u>Project Pitch</u>

I am Baldwin Avendano pastor of Calexico Methodist Church, and director of "Loving Our Neighbors" assistance program for migrants. Our mission is to love asylum seekers, wherever and whoever they are, providing support in their emotional, spiritual and physical needs. We collaborate with the Department of Homeland Security, Border Patrol, CBP, Border Compassion, Catholic Charities, United Methodist Committee on Relief, Jewish Families, ACLU, and many others. CBP reports for 2022 a record-breaking of 2.4 million migrant encounters at the border with Mexico, in addition, those at federal facilities, and several more in Mexico seeking asylum. Since we launched in December 2018, we have served over 10,000 migrants on both sides of the border with food, clothing, women and baby products, hygiene & health kits, and much more; we also assist refugees released by ICE and CBP with transportation and providing shelter.

We serve individuals and family units of different nationalities, victims of extreme violence and injustice. We can't change their past, but we are here to make a difference in their present.

Project | SHINE Initiative - Breaking Silos, Building Bridges, Cultivating Community

#### <u> Project Pitch</u>

I am Cathie Capp, Lead Pastor at University United Methodist Church in Irvine. "Belong" is one of our Core Values, and UUMC Irvine has lived this out for decades, inviting community groups to meet on our campus as well as extending interfaith hospitality to both Jewish and Muslim Groups. Our 37 year partnership with Families Forward, as well as Scouts, 12-step groups, Children's Choirs, and more makes for a vibrant, bustling campus, but the need for belonging still exists. In the past two years religious and racial hate crimes against grew by 34% and isolation increased. Individuals and families long for belonging and purpose in community, as shared by Lydia, a mother attending a recent event. Our goal is to break silos, build bridges, and cultivate community between the church and the community at large. Addressing these physical and emotional hungers, our mission to Share, Hope, Inspire, Nurture, Everyone – or SHINE – will provide a meal, engaging activities, and opportunities for learning and community service across ages, languages, and faith traditions.

Rev. Karin Ellis La Canada United Methodist Church La Canada, CA Project | The Oaks Youth Center

#### <u>Testimony</u>

"I have enjoyed being a part of the the 2022 Pastor Cohort. During my initial interview with Hyepin, she explained that this program would take a lot of work and time and she was right! It has been challenging, but I have learned so much. I now have some of the tools necessary to better engage and partner with the community in order to shine both my light and the light of our church. I have also really enjoyed getting to know my fellow colleagues and am so grateful for the wonderful work they are doing! I will carry with me the tools and wisdom I have gained as I help our church become a visible and viable presence in the community."

#### <u>Project Pitch</u>

Hi! I am Karin Ellis, Senior Pastor at La Canada UMC in La Canada, CA. We have been serving the community for 58 years. Our church would like to create a youth center for the youth of our community. Currently, there is not a place in our community dedicated for youth is grades 7-12 to gather and have meaningful interaction.

Youth today are struggling. 45% of California youth between the ages of 12-17 reported having struggled with mental health issues. Anxiety, pressure to do well in school, drugs, and family dynamics all weigh heavily on our youth. Our youth need to know they are loved and cherished.

Our Youth Center will be open after school. The students will be able to do their homework, play games, engage in meaningful conversations, and participate in a service project once a month. They will also interact with positive adult mentors who will help with homework.

Our church is located right across the street from the public junior and high schools. Previously, we reached out to the students by offering snacks after school, and we would like to restart that program on January 11. This would be the launching event to help establish a safe place for youth to gather on our campus.

Aloha my name is Rev Sione at Parker UMC in Kaneohe, Hawaii. Our mission for over 95 years has been to be connected in Prayer, All & Serve. As a multicultural & multigenerational church, we have the opportunity to serve our low-income community.

Through Community Partnership we have been able to provide food for over 1000 families and fundraise over \$5,000 to help support local struggling families. The need for our after school Initiative - "New Beginnings" came out of the concerns of our young families. Hawaii is the most expensive state to live in and it is a struggle! New Beginnings at Parker UMC will be providing after School Mentorship & Tutoring. This is in partnership with Ben Parker Elementary & Grace Common a local nonprofit mentoring program. Our After School initiative will start in the New School year of 2023 and will be offered on Monday – Friday, from 3-6 pm. We will be helping over 25 Student with focus on Math & English. We hope that as the program grows, to provide mentorship, relationship & clothing to local families & children.

Project | Kingdom Common Grounds

#### <u> Project Pitch</u>

I am Christian Jung, Senior Pastor of Reseda UMC in CA. I have 20 years of ministry experience, having served 7 churches throughout the country, planted homeless ministry in all 7, a food pantry in 4, and prison ministry in 3 of those churches. The dream of Kingdom Common Grounds began after filming a school project in Texas with a homeless named Bobby. What he said at the end changed my life: "Christian, these few hours with you were the best time of my life!" If our common ground of the moment can spark life in a person, I will invest my life in building such a common ground! Now, I envision a coffee house called Kingdom Common Grounds where dreams are brewed, hopes rise... It's where people come to share their aifts to experience the abundance of life. As a seeding ministry, our farmers market-style Kingdom Food Pantry serves over 700 people weekly to counter 70,000 cases of homelessness LA County experienced this year! We partner with Rescue Mission, LA Family Housing, and Dignity Health to bring mobile showers and health clinics to the needy. We also provide hot meals, free clothes, and counseling for their immediate needs.

Now, we dream of a laundromat, hair salon, and much more! Will you partner with us to see our dream come true?





Rev. Brenda Kilioni-Paongo Trinity United Methodist Church Pomona, CA Project | Beloved Pomona

#### Project Pitch

Hi, I'm Brenda Kilioni Paongo, lead pastor of Trinity United Methodist Church located at the heart of old town Pomona. Established in 1953. We have been serving the community of Pomona for over 25 years through feeding programs, and being one of the few locations to offer free showers to our homeless and at-need neighbors. Our space is also used as a retreat center. For instance, Kairos Outside Prison Ministry of Southern California since 1990 addressing the spiritual needs of spouses, parents, and relatives of those in prison; for loved ones often do time right along with their loved ones. Today, Pomona is the 5th largest city in Los Angeles County made up of a diverse population of over 160,000+

residents. 71.5% are Hispanics. Here are some figures that call for our attention to the urgent needs of many trapped in the cycle of poverty and hopelessness. We're striving to expand our collaboration with current partners to partner with existing organizations already in place in our neighborhood to help those in need. The space created is working with partners on setting a set date and time for our first community engagement to be announced soon. We're envisioning a transformed Pomona where ALL have A hope and a future. Will you partner with us? CHECK us OUT.





Rev. Eun Bok Kim Keystone Korean Baptist Church Odessa, FL

Project | Tampa Bay Korean Center & Affordable Housing Initiative

#### <u>Testimony</u>

"I am so grateful to have met Hyepin Im, she introduced me to the C2 Leadership Institute. The past few months, I have learned many valuable skills and connections to help better my church and community. The C2 Leadership Institute program gave me the opportunity to network and discover community partners that support the needs of our community. I understand the importance of reaching out to community leaders directly to voice certain community needs.."

#### Project Pitch

Hello, my name is Eun Bok Kim. I am the senior pastor at Keystone Korean Baptist Church. I am pleased to share our Tampa Bay Korean Community Center and Affordable Housing Initiative. 38 years ago I came to the US, I started as a dishwasher and ended up opening five restaurants. In my work, I am very familiar with the struggles of being an immigrant. Our mission is to positively impact those in need which was inspired by Scriptures. Living in Florida, I noticed the elderly population has had the highest population growth at 64%. Florida suffers the highest rent increase in the US. We have a large Korean presence of 25,000 in the Tampa Bay area. Many Korean immigrants face high language barriers which lead to various challenges and yet there is not a single Korean community center available to serve the community. Our vision is to build affordable housing and community center that will provide housing and educational opportunities for the local community. Currently we have 2 acres of vacant land available to make this vision possible. The community center will include our vision of a gymnasium, financial literary programs, and a daycare for children and elderly. Instead of waiting to help seniors, we recently hosted our first senior housing application seminar which was a success. We are honored to have so many different partners on board. We hope you will also partner with us as well.





Rev. Rae Lathrop Desert Spring United Methodist Church Las Vegas, NV Project | Connectable

#### <u> Project Pitch</u>

My name is Rae Lathrop and I'm proud to work for the Desert Spring Community Resource Center, which is an initiative of the Desert Spring UMC. DSUMC has 30 years of community involvement in southern Nevada. One of our flagship programs is an advent donation made to local or global organizations now totalling over \$400,000. In 2020, the advent donation was used to seed the Community Resource Center, which started as a food pantry and has seen tremendous growth since. We've been able to match that initial investment with funding from Clark County, State of Nevada, and Three Square food bank. As we've grown our program, I've talked with a client about their lives and sometimes the circumstances that brings them to us. We know that food insecurity is linked to other larger concerns and trend right alongside other economic indicators. The national low income housing coalitions says that for every 10% increase in the share of households severely cost-burdened is linked to 86,000 more people who are food insecure. That's why we are launching, connectable - a supportive program that matches clients of our food pantry with volunteers to walk alongside with them to find pathways for self sufficiency and independence. We're using the Open Table framework, an evidence based social program, that has shown high success with clients. Volunteers will work together as a team - and use their own experiences to support clients. What we've learned the most since we launched the food pantry, is that it's lonely right now. If you're worried where your next meal may come from, you probably don't have anyone else to count on. You can be a part of this program by giving your time and expertise, referring anyone as a client, or giving a donation to support the ongoing training and program management. Thank you.





Rev. Samuel Nam Aiea United Methodist Church Aiea, HI Project | Tech Literacy Collab

#### <u>Testimony</u>

" C2 Leadership Institute compelled us to think of ministry outside the walls of our church, to be outward focused in shining our light brightly. C2 Leadership Institute reminded me of the power of connection and partnership in ministry and in life. The coursework was demanding, probably on par with a seminary-level class and Hyepin always came prepared, ready to equip us with new tools and expose us to expert advice. I am grateful for this experience."

#### Project Pitch

Aloha, my name is Sam Nam and I am the senior pastor of Aiea United Methodist Church and I also lead Tech Literacy Collab(TLC), a community initiative of Aiea UMC whose aim is to educate the seniors in our community to safely navigate the digital landscape.

AUMC began as a small Japanese language fellowship 122 years ago and in our rich history, we have maintained close ties with the community and our multicultural heritage. The pandemic lockdowns of 2 years ago compelled many in our community to do more of their interactions online whether it was school, work, church worship, or basic commerce and communication. The trouble is that many of our older adults have often fallen behind by not adapting or fallen victim to scammers. Last year alone in the state of Hawaii 470 seniors reported being scammed via emails and text messages. We even had a scammer emailing my church members recently! We at TLC hope to assist seniors in three specific categories: Communication, eCommerce, and Cybersecurity. The good news is we're not doing this alone. We have potential community partnerships with the United States Navy, our local government officials, two banks, and other non-profits working in related fields. We are always looking to expand our partnerships with like-minded individuals and organizations so I ask: will you partner with us to make a difference?





Marcy Palos Restore LA CDC Los Angeles, CA

Project | Dolar Agradable & RLA Students Bank

#### <u>Testimony</u>

"I have had the privilege of being a part of the Fall 2022 Cohort of C2 Leadership Institute. This cohort has been a huge blessing in assisting me as I transition from a ministry role to a director of a Community Development Corporation (CDC). The C2 Leadership Institute course has taught me how to use practical tools in setting up our CDC as an organization that shines its light and creates great impact for the community we have been serving for decades. We forget in ministry the type of work we do on an everyday basis, the C2 Leadership Institute team has helped us to focus on how the work we are already doing can have a greater impact!"

#### <u> Project Pitch</u>

Hello I'm Marcy Palos, I'm the President and Founder of RestoreLA-CDC. We are in direct affiliation with Iglesia de Restauracion Los Angeles, one of the Largest Hispanic Churches in Los Angeles. RestoreLA-CDC believes Latino families have the potential of breaking cycles of poverty and generational wealth when giving tools to thrive! The average Latino household in Los Angeles has an income of 40 thousand dollars which is way below the average LA income is 60K thousand dollars. They are also statistically the worse prepared for retirement. Our organization has been serving our community for over 30 years. Which includes relief work which we have done for decades. But after the pandemic we realized we wanted to make a deeper impact and launched RestoreLA-CDC because we knew our community needed change on a deeper level, and since then we have served hundreds of families and counting.





Jun Park Relief Aid for North Korea Los Angeles, CA Project | RANK - Relief Aid for North Korea

#### <u>Testimony</u>

"I have learned greatly from participating in the 2022 C2 Leadership Institute Cohort. I wanted to get my non-profit, RANK, Relief Aid of North Koreans off the ground and running. Participating in the Cohort allowed me to do it. From input from Hye Pin, the speakers, and fellow members of the Cohort, I learned how to get the funders, partners, and create programs to assist the North Korean refugees and asylumseekers. I am grateful for the opportunity."

#### Project Pitch

My name is Jun Park. Since 2018 I have assisted more than 300 unhoused people to obtain temporary and permanent housing as the Housing Coordinator for APCTC. I have 25 years of combined experience from working at the Embassy of Korea, Boys & Girls Club, serving at 5 churches, and running my own business. When I heard the heart-wrenching escape story of a daring NK refugee named Nancy, I started RANK, Relief Aid of North Koreans. As the first organized assistance program focused on North Koreans resettlement in the U.S., RANK's mission is to assist North Koreans to achieve their American Dream. According to WRAPS, Worldwide Refugee Admissions Processing System, there are approximately 300 NK refugees and 250 asylum-seekers in the U.S. since 2000. Also, 7 out of 10 NKs in L.A. need assistance in housing, employment, and education. RANK assists NKs to secure affordable housing, gainful employment, and free tutoring for their children. It has partnered with (HACLA), (LAHSA) and FACE's AAPI Career Initiative, and more. We have served 50 NKs so far & projected to reach 300 in a year.

Rev. Gina Pollard City Square Church Phoenix, AZ

Project | Community Connections: Supper and Storytelling

#### <u> Project Pitch</u>

Hi, I'm Gina Pollard, Senior Pastor of City Square Church in downtown Phoenix. City Square is committed to connecting to the community in justice and mercy work. We have been active with community partners in providing food and clothing to over 2000 immigrants, the unsheltered, and Native Americans on the reservations in northern Arizona. We understand that connection to those around us is essential for mental and physical health. According to Cigna healthcare research, 53% of all Americans feel lonely and disconnected, which costs approximately \$154B in lost productivity. My project, "Community Connections: Supper and Storytelling," invites people from various backgrounds to find community and connection at the supper table, hearing each other's stories. By pulling topics from current events and areas of individual concern, participants will be invited to share their experiences with the issues in the news. We want to build bridges and reduce loneliness. Building bridges reduces loneliness with the potential for increasing productivity and personal well-being. Will you partner with us to bring better connection and mental health to our community?

Since 2013 \*slide\* our mission is to help transition our unhoused neighbors in restoring their dignity, self-sustainability, and into a positive community. On any given night, according to LA County Homeless Initiative, there are 70,000 homeless...49,000 who are on the streets. Today, we've reached over 4,000 people. We've provided 600 mobile showers \*slide\*, 5,500 meals, 2,500 pcs of clothing by collaborating with \*slide\* passionate like-minded partners to create a solution for this problem. When we first met Jose, he was homeless and an alcoholic. Walking with Jose, he overcame his addiction and his dream came true by reuniting him with his daughter after 15 years and aranddaughter who he has never seen. Through our program, Jose is no longer homeless and is now part of his loved ones lives again. We plan to reach 500 new unhoused neighbors by the end of the upcoming year through training and hiring staff.

Project | Project Neighborhood-Blocking Out Hunger

#### <u>Project Pitch</u>

Greetings, my name is Akanesi Tupou, and I am the lead pastor of the Morongo Basin Cooperative Parish of the United Methodist Church. In the Morongo Basin at Twentynine Palms UMC, we are a small local congregation with big hearts and we have a mission...To end spiritual and physical hunger. The project being planned is named Project Neighborhood-Blocking Out Hunger. A couple of ways we can put this into action is by nurturing our neighbor's needs. One, we worship, fellowship, and gather for Bible study to feed the spiritual needs for over 30 yrs thus far. Second, by providing three days out of the week fresh fruits, vegetables, and protein products to the community we can ensure they are fed physically 7 days weekly. It was reported in 2021 that just over twenty-five percent of residents in the Morongo Basin were not receiving food security. That's about over 2000 that were left with no food. Essential to the plan is to reach individuals and families that live in the outer pocket areas of the desert ends. Because of the limited amount of food that is available. It does not include protein, fresh fruits, or fresh vegetables. They are accessible only if you have transportation four times a week. Our goal is to provide and distribute to the Morongo Basin residents living below the poverty line with the basic essential needs met seven days a week. We need your help in leasing or purchasing a vantype vehicle that can carry and deliver fresh fruits/vegetables and protein to the community will help to stop hunger. Partnering for resources and funds can feed families, individuals, and the less fortunate. Listed here are our current community partnerships. #### <u>Project Pitch</u>

My name is Rick Uhls. I'm the Lead Pastor at Shepherd of the Hills United Methodist Church. Most people might never guess food insecurity is a problem here behind the Orange Curtain. But the reality is that 12.7% of residents here live with food insecurity. At Shepherd of the Hills, we have a non-profit organization called "Shepherd Community Table." Our goal is to help alleviate food insecurity and provide other services to food insecure residents who often experience additional challenges. Each Wednesday evening on our Rancho Santa Margarita campus, we provide a free hot meal to anyone who shows up and provide access to our food pantry. Currently we serve over a hundred people each Wednesday. We partner with nine other faith communities, schools, and businesses, that help with this initiative. With our food pantry, 50-60 families have been fed each week who would otherwise have gone hungry and yet we know the need is greater. We want to expand this program to our Mission Viejo campus and purchase a van for delivery service to those without transportation. But the needs of our clients go beyond just having enough food. Several of our clients talk of how difficult it is to find a place to wash their clothes as there is no laundromat in Rancho Santa Margarita. It is pretty much impossible to get a job or to obtain other services if you don't have clean clothes. We plan on providing a mobile laundromat for those who have no other means of washing their clothes. We are seeking people and organizations who will partner with us in meeting these needs. Will you partner with us?

Project | Inter-generational Affordable Housing

#### Project Pitch

My name is Eve Williams and I am the pastor of Advent United Methodist Church, a Place to Call home, in Las Vegas, NV and I'm excited to tell you about our Intergenerational Affordable Housing initiative. Each year, more than 23,000 youth age out of foster care when they turn 18, most of them without the safety nets provided by family and community that typical teenagers may take for granted. As a result, many of them are likely to experience homelessness and many other challenges. Meanwhile, 28% of the elderly live alone and also have a profound need for community and connection. A groundbreaking Harvard study showed community and relationships are critical to an increased quality of life among groups such as these. For almost 40 years, Advent United Methodist Church has been a place to call home. Our mission has always been to support the community by building community. We have up to 2 acres on which we plan to build 40-60 units of intergenerational affordable housing, including affordable child care, a health care center, a community garden and a resource center. But what we'll actually build is connection and belonging. We are excited to be partnering with KG Development Group, United Methodist Social Ministries, National Equity Fund, potentially The Open Table, and we are engaging with many others. We'd love to have you partner with us, too.





Rev. Christopher Wurpts North Scottsdale United Methodist Church Scottsdale, AZ

Project | Caring for Foster Children/Low Income Housing

#### <u>Testimony</u>

"The C2 Leadership Institute program was just the tool our church needed to launch us into a more robust community partnership with our local leaders, non-profits, and businesses. I gained the tools necessary to jump-start programs that I'd previously only hoped would happen "someday." We're looking forward to our most fruitful season of ministry yet."

#### Project Pitch

Good morning. My name is Christopher Wurpts, and I am the Lead Pastor at North Scottsdale United Methodist Church. According to the Arizona Department of Child Safety, there are currently over fourteen thousand children in the state foster care system. Out of those, approximately 900 of them will be aging out of that system in the next year, and one out of every five of those young people will be homeless by the time they are twenty-six years old. Our church has had a long history of carina for foster children in our state. We created a non-profit that helps foster children find long-term employment. We partner with local agencies to provide hundreds of beds and car seats to families caring for foster kids. And now, as we look to the future, we are exploring how we can provide long-term transitional housing for some of these kids. Our hope is that, within the next five years, we will have found a way to construct several small homes on our campus to serve as a "home base" for young adults aging out of the foster care system. Do you have any ideas or resources you could connect us to to help make our dream a reality?

### FACE PROGRAMS

#### Affordable Housing

In 2012, FACE was successful in organizing faith and community leaders to advocate for a community benefit from J.H. Snyder, who was receiving \$17 million in public funds for building a \$169 million mixed use project in Koreatown. In the aftermath, FACE has partnered with AMCAL Multi-housing Inc. in developing 100 units of affordable housing, called Meridian Apartments.

#### Church & Non-Profit Leadership and Advocacy Training

FACE has trained over 5,000 faith and community leaders how to leverage resources, navigate government, create partnerships, implement programs and services and effectively advocate for their community. FACE has also created a Faith and Community Collaborative on Mental Health and Drug Abuse to connect faith leaders with resources in the community.

#### C2 (Church and Community) Leadership Institute

C2 Leadership Institute is a transformative leadership program that empowers leaders and awakens them to new possibilities and sustainability for their ministries by strengthening church and community partnerships in community development through community engagement and advocacy.

#### Youth and Adult Job Training and Internships

FACE has trained many individuals both youth, college, adult workers, and seniors in job and leadership skills through our various internships, volunteer program, as well as city and federal programs including Americorps VISTA.

#### API JOB (Job Opportunities and Business Success) Initiative

FACE, as lead agency, won a grant funded by the City of Los Angeles Economic and Workforce Development Department to launch the API JOBS Initiative. This initiative is the first of its kind in Los Angeles to serve the Asian Pacific Islander (API) community in providing vocational training, employment, career pathway, and community/social services to linguistically isolated participants.

#### AAPI Youth@Work Career Pathways Initiative

FACE'S AAPI Career Pathways Initiative is a partnership with LA County Workforce Development, Aging and Community Services that provides youth with paid internship opportunities in public and private sectors. In addition to job training, through this unique opportunity, AAPI Interns will be able to gain leadership skills and be mentored by influential leaders from CEOs to government officials.
